### **UWM COLLEGE FOR KIDS, TEEN UNIVERSITY REPORT OPENINGS FOR SUMMER SESSIONS**

Milwaukee -- The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee College for Kids 2003 Program offers exceptional opportunities for parents seeking fun and engaging classes to keep their children intellectually active this summer.

College for Kids has openings in both one-week sessions: Session I: June 23-27 and Session II: July 14-18. Classes also are available during the following two-week sessions: Session I: June 16-June 27; Session II, July 7-July 18; Session III, July 21-Aug. 1.

The program's tradition of innovation and excellence in academic enrichment programs for children in grades K-8 has drawn more than 3,000 students annually to the Kenwood campus over the past two decades. Now there also is a limited program for teenagers in grades 9-12.

UWM faculty and other specially selected teachers lead the one-and two-week classes. Each class is limited in size to 16 students. The classes are for children entering 5-K through 12th grade in fall, 2003.

Exciting hands-on learning opportunities in math, science, fine arts and humanities provide children and adolescents with high academic potential, motivation or talent a summer educational supplement.
